Hercule Poirot is about to tuck into a very traditional English supper with his old friend Bonnington when a lone diner sparks his interest. Like clockwork, the man has eaten at the restaurant on Thursdays and Tuesdays for the last ten years, but no one on the staff knows his name. When "Old Father Time," as they have fondly nicknamed him, suddenly stops coming, Poirot believes that he might have picked up the one essential clue that could shed light on this mysterious man. Could what Old Father Time ordered as his final meal provide the key?

The London police trace a series of thefts to Bertram's Hotel while Miss Marple is there on vacation. Abduction, train robbery, and the murder of the doorman all confuse the authorities, but Miss Marple deduces the truth to solve the crime.

Previously published in the print anthology The Thirteen Problems. A woman is warned by a psychic of the evil and danger in her house. On a full moon, she must watch for the signs: blue primrose means caution, blue hollyhock is danger, and blue geranium is death!

Miss Marple senses danger when she visits a friend living in a Victorian mansion which doubles as a rehabilitation centre for young delinquents. Her fears are confirmed when a youth fires a gun at the administrator, but that isn't the only shooting!

In 1931, a young woman writer living in Germany was inspired by Anita Loos's *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes* to describe pre-war Berlin and the age of cinematic glamour through the eyes of a woman. The resulting novel, *The Artificial Silk Girl*, became an acclaimed bestseller and a masterwork of German literature, in the tradition of Christopher Isherwood's *Berlin Stories* and Bertolt Brecht's *Three Penny Opera*. Like Isherwood and Brecht, Keun revealed the dark underside of Berlin's "golden twenties" with empathy and honesty. Unfortunately, a Nazi censorship board banned Keun's work in 1933 and destroyed all existing copies of *The Artificial Silk Girl*.
