Proposal for Stopping Child Labour through Education and ...

Child Labor and Education already brings together the major UN agencies, the World Bank and civil society groups with high-level political leadership it could deliver results. Compulsory education has the potential to provide a powerful impetus towards the eradication of child labor - just as it did in 19th century Britain.

The desires of low-income parents to send their children to work or to employ them at home, and of employers who seek low wage, pliable, non-unionized labour, is of secondary importance because

elsewhere in the world a large proportion of parents and employers have also supported child labour and opposed compulsory education.

The achievement of the Sustainable Development Goal for Education rests on children being free to go to school rather than working to support their families, while ensuring decent work (SDG 8) and eliminating all child labor will be impossible without quality education for all children.

It is children's work that is exploitative and dangerous ('child labour') that poses a major human rights and socio-economic challenge. Universal primary education may be the single most effective instrument for meeting this challenge, but because of research inadequacies and the multiplicity of factors involved, a neat causal relationship cannot be established.
