In inpatient settings, in 1 study of 303 adults there was evidence that recent (past month) and lifetime history of physical aggression and recent verbal or against object aggression were associated with an increased risk of violence on the ward. However, the evidence was inconclusive as to whether a history (lifetime) of verbal or against object aggression was associated with the risk of violence.

### **Treating Aggression in Forensic Psychiatric Settings ...**

Background. Workplace violence (WPV) against healthcare workers (HCWs) employed in psychiatric inpatient wards is a serious occupational issue that involves both staff and patients; the consequences of WPV may include increased service costs and lower standards of care.

### **Workplace Violence Toward Mental Healthcare Workers ...**

In some cases, the individuals' aggression and violence may need to be managed medically by sedation. This will be dependent on the patient and their situation and medication will be used as a last resort in these situations (Fulde & Preisz 2011).
