Collana PAESAGGI IN TRASFORMAZIONE diretta da Enrico Alfonso Corti In queste pagine viene presentata una raccolta di esperienze di workshop e di laboratorio didattico maturate all'interno di alcune attività promosse negli ultimi anni dal Dipartimento di Architettura dell'Università degli Studi di Cagliari, elaborate durante la predisposizione del Piano Paesaggistico Regionale e la conseguente modificazione dei quadri normativi di riferimento per la pianificazione urbanistica comunale. I contributi riguardano le coste orientali della Sardegna ricadenti all'interno dei territori comunali di Villasimius e di Villaputzu. Le attività documentate, inoltre, sono state sviluppate nello stesso arco temporale del corso di formazione per tecnici regionali - Progetto I.T.A.C.A. - in rapporto al quale ci si è proposti di ampliare il campo della sperimentazione e di estendere la formazione a giovani professionisti e a laureandi. Il volume, sottolinea il prof. Corti nella sua introduzione, propone un percorso educativo che mira alla ricostruzione di percezioni condivise dei luoghi e che pratica la "formazione al paesaggio" attraverso l'esperienza problematica di "dare forma al paesaggio". Un work in progress, come evidenzia la riflessione conclusiva dedicata all'operato dell'artista sarda Maria Lai nel paesaggio di Ulassai. Nicoletta Sale (Cagliari, 1974) Dopo la laurea in Ingegneria Edile conseguita nel 2000 presso la Facoltà di Ingegneria di Cagliari a cui segue la specializzazione in Architettura bioecologica e tecnologie sostenibili per l'ambiente alla Facoltà di Architettura "La Sapienza" di Roma, ha svolto attività di ricerca all'interno del Dipartimento di Architettura della Facoltà di Cagliari e seguito i laboratori di Architettura e Composizione Architettonica, conseguendo il titolo di dottore di ricerca con una tesi dal titolo Paesaggio e Identità. Ipotesi paradigmatiche e applicazioni di metodo per il progetto di paesaggio; ha maturato esperienze professionali in Italia ed all'estero.

Green Light is a project initiated by artist Olafur eliasson in collaboration with Thysen-Bornemisza Art Contemporary, vienna. Conceived as a field of production and mutual learning, Green Light works with refugees, asylum seekers, migrants, and NGOs to fabricate an unlimited edition of fully functional lamps, which are geometric, stackable modules made from recyclable materials that are fitted with a welcoming green light. Providing fundraising and education opportunities, Green Light workshops first took place in vienna in 2016, and have since been hosted at the Moody Center for the Arts (Houston) and the 57th Venice Biennale. The publication seeks to question and reflect on the project through testimonies, stories, and memories by the participants and founders as well as reflect on the relationship between culture and migration today. With more than twenty contributors including Atif Akin, Anas Aljajeh, Tarek Atoui, Tawab Baran, Ian Cion, Angela Dimittrakaki, and Olafur Green Light participants, among others.

Maria Lai (1919-2013) is the most international one among the artists born in Sardinia, celebrated in 2007 at the Venice Biennale and in the most prestigious one of all contemporary art exhibitions in the world: the Documenta exhibition in Athens and Kassel sites; in 2018 she will play a leading role in an important exhibition at the Palazzo Pitti in Florence, promoted by the Uffizi Gallery. This volume retraces all lines of research, through works selected at public collections but largely identified inside international private collections. The advancements of her path are associated with numerous unpublished materials, frequently essential to recreate actions born to remain ephemeral, stated by historiography as "the first tests of Relational Art?" at European level. Lai, as a matter of fact, overturned the relationship between the artist and the observer, turning people into the original artists of the work. That's a new way of thinking and performing art, not getting rid of the established one but rather matching it and extending its meaning.

American artist Alexander Calder (1898-1976) created a "new line" that was not simply an evolution of forms and styles. From

the start, it was clear to all who witnessed him at work that he was doing something radically new. This book, published to accompany a major exhibition, shows how Calder's work emerged from expectations of change in American popular culture. Twelve essays from major contributors explore how Calder, among the first college-trained artists, found techniques and inspiration in many disciplines and their development, including technology, engineering, architecture, physics, and astronomy. All these contributed to the development of his wire sculptures, mobiles, and stabiles, including his famous Circus. Superb photographs of more than 100 works and comparative illustrations guide readers through this innovative and unique path.

This volume is a monograph of the 47 species of the Dulcamaroid clade of the large and diverse genus Solanum. Species in the group occur in North, Central and South America, and in Europe and Asia. The group is most species-rich in Peru and Brazil, and three of the component species, Solanum laxum of Brazil, Solanum seforthianum of the Caribbean and Solanum crispum of Chile are cultivated in many parts of the world. All species are illustrated and a distribution map of each is provided. All names are typified and nomenclatural and bibliographic details for all typifications presented. One new species from Ecuador is described. The monograph is the first complete taxonomic treatment of these species since the worldwide monograph of Solanum done by the French botanist Michel-Felix Dunal in 1852.

This book is the first important monograph dedicated to the work of Pablo Reinoso, a Franco-Argentinian artist and designer, a curious and largely self-taught jack of all trades. Technically a sculptor, but actually an artist through and through, Pablo Reinoso has been exploring multifarious artistic avenues from an early age. Part-French, through his mother, he left his native Argentina in 1978 and settled in Paris, where he worked on his art. He produces his works in series - Articulations (1970-80), Water Landscapes (1981-86), The Discovery of America (1986-89), Breathing Sculptures (1995-2002) - which he chops up and rummages through as he explores new worlds and different materials, translating the permanent work in progress which is his way of thinking. An increasing maturity is evident in Ashes to Ashes (2002), a work in which he twists and splits wooden boards in an attempt to rid them of their function. Continuing in the same vein, but having in the meantime held important positions as an artistic director and designer in large companies, Reinoso began a new series in 2004 highlighting an icon of industrial design, the Thonet chair. He then turned his attention to the seemingly anonymous public benches found in all cultures throughout the world - objects that for this very reason are timeless and beyond fashion. The results are his so-called Spaghetti Benches (begun in 2006), which have multiplied and found their place in the most unlikely corners. In his very latest series, Scribbling Benches (started in 2009), Reinoso no longer takes an anonymous bench, nor an iconic chair, as his point of departure, but a steel girder. The work plays on the unexpectedness of a solid, heavy object, a key structural component in architecture, that is made to twist like a piece of wire and turn into a bench suggesting airy, transparent, contemplative spaces.

In questo breve percorso, dedicato a coloro i quali si avvicinano per la prima volta a questa grande artista e desiderano scoprire qualcosa in più sul suo conto, si riscoprono alcuni tra i temi fondamentali della sua filosofia: il legame con la comunità e il tentativo di avvicinare le persone all'arte; il desiderio di tramandare la memoria riscoprendo le più antiche tradizioni; il bisogno di continuare a giocare tutta la vita, perché proprio giocando si può immaginare ciò che sembra impossibile e

impegnarsi per raggiungerlo. Lezioni preziose che l'artista ha maturato in anni e anni di intenso lavoro, mediati dalle figure di maestri importanti come Salvatore Cambosu e Arturo Martini. Tutto questo avviene attraverso la trattazione di alcune tra le sue opere più belle e coinvolgenti, arricchite dalle voci di alcune persone che con lei hanno vissuto e condiviso importanti esperienze,

ma anche dalle parole della artista stessa, trascritte dall'inedito archivio video del regista Francesco Casu, suo fidato amico e collaboratore. Partendo dall'opera più famosa in assoluto Legarsi alla montagna, che vide il paese di Ulassai coinvolto in una performance di arte ambientale nata dalle credenze e i miti locali, il percorso passa al tema della memoria, espresso in opere quali Le Fiabe cucite e la Barca di Carta, che propongono il libro come ogget-

to artistico. I giochi come I luoghi dell'arte a portata di mano e il Volo del gioco dell'oca coinvolgono lo spettatore in una attività di gruppo che attraverso l'espedito ludico lo avvicina al mondo dell'arte. Infine giungono le proposte per il futuro come la sua idea di una Stanza dell'arte per tutte le scuole, con la quale accompagnare i bambini e i ragazzi verso un vero contatto con l'opera.
