junction. The key to the correct presentation of not only ... but also is balance.

When using not only . . . but also in a sentence, parallelism should be the goal. It means that the words following both parts of this correlative conjunction (i.e., not only and but also) should belong to the same parts of speech. For example, if a verb follows not only, then a verb should also follow but also. Using different parts of speech after each part of not only . . . but also makes the ...

Paired conjunctions (or correlative conjunctions) - both...and, either...or, neither...nor, not only...but also - join 2 things. Each of these four has its own usage. Both ... and: The first of the paired conjunctions - both ... and - connects 2 positive things, such as noun subjects, noun objects, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, prepositional phrases, and other words.

Okay, so using not only, but also in the middle and end of a sentence I can say, "I've taught English

not only in the U.S., but also in other countries." Or you could say, let's say you're talking about someone who is a model. You could say, "She's not only beautiful, but also very smart."

How to form English sentences with NOT ONLY + BUT ALSO ...

The combination not only/but also is similar to both/and because it shows that both items presented are included. However, the item after not only is normally something we expect the speaker to say, whereas the item after but also is often something unexpected: I not only like to eat cake and cookies, but I also enjoy baking.
