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What is the Person-Centred Approach? Person-Centred counselling/psychotherapy was the first talking therapy to be based on empirical research. In the 1940s and 50s Dr Carl Rogers and his colleagues audio-recorded therapy sessions to try and determine which therapist interventions were effective for clients.

A person centred approach should be demonstrated by all staff and be ingrained in the company culture and agreed ways
