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Place: St Kilda, Scotland, UK. Where: A remote group of islands 50 miles off the west coast of the Isle Of Harris in the Outer Hebrides. Remoteness: 7 / 10. BESbswy. BESbswy. Accessibility: Medium. Overview: A group of remote Scottish islands with stunning scenery framed by the highest sea cliffs in the UK.

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Lying 41 miles off the west coast of Benbecula, the archipelago of St Kilda is an extreme Atlantic outpost, and one of the few World Heritage Sites in existence awarded 'Dual' status for meeting both the natural and cultural criteria for the classification. With its clear waters and craggy sea cliffs (including one that ranks as Europe's highest) it is not surprising that St Kilda is home to the continent's largest colony of seabirds including gannets and puffins.

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
