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Base Rate Fallacy is a cognitive fallacy. The Base Rate Fallacy is an error in reasoning which occurs when someone reaches a conclusion that fails to account for an earlier premise - usually a base rate, a probability or some other statistic.

The Base rate fallacy is a common cognitive error that skews decision-making whereby information about the occurrence of some common characteristic within a given population is ignored or not given much weight in decision making. Many cognitive errors are the results of people not paying attention to base rates.

Base Rate Fallacy Background. The classic scientific demonstration of the base rate fallacy comes from an experiment, performed by psychologists Amos Tversky and Daniel Kahneman, in which participants received a description of 5 individuals apparently selected at random from a pool of descriptions that contained 70 lawyers and 30 engineers, or vice versa. Participants were asked to predict whether each of the 5 individuals was a lawyer or an engineer.

A classic explanation for the base rate fallacy involves a scenario in which 85% of cabs in a city are blue and the rest are green. One night, a cab is involved in a hit and run accident. A witness claims the cab was green, however later tests show that they only correctly identify the color of the cab at night 80% of the time.

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The base rate fallacy is common in analytics and especially in fraud analytics, and is often seen with an imbalanced target variable in Supervised Machine Learning. 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The base rate fallacy is a tendency to focus on specific informa-

tion over general probabilities. For example: 1 in 1000 students cheat on an exam. A cheating detection system catches cheaters with a 5% false positive rate. All 1000 students are tested by the system. The cheating detection system catches Sara. What is the chance that Sara is innocent? Many people who answer the question focus on the 5% false positive rate and exclude the general statistic that 999 out of 1000 students are innocent.

The base rate fallacy is a specific mistake of this type, that is, a failure to use all relevant information in an inductive inference.
