As noted earlier, effective and explicit instruction can be viewed as providing a series of instructional supports or scaffolds—first through the logical selection and sequencing of content, and then by breaking down that content into manageable instructional units based on students' cognitive capabilities (e.g., working memory

Explicit phonics, also referred to as synthetic phonics, builds from part to whole. It begins with the instruction of the letters (graphemes) with their associated sounds (phonemes). Next, explicit phonics teaches blending and building, beginning with blending the sounds into syllables and then into words.

High impact teaching strategies (HITS)

A study on the explicit teaching of reading strategy was conducted by Ng (1999) who taught inferential strategies explicitly to a group of Secondary 5 Normal (Academic) students. These students showed improvement in inferential comprehension in the post reading test.

Delivering Explicit Vocabulary Instruction: Using the ...

Explicit, systematic instruction, sometimes simply referred to as explicit instruction, involves teaching a specific concept or procedure in a highly structured and carefully sequenced manner. Research has indicated that teaching mathematics in this manner is highly effective and can significantly improve a student's ability to perform mathematical operations (e.g., adding, multiplying, finding the square root) as well as to solve word problems.

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
